Reshaping Rochester Awards honorees named

The recipients of the first Reshaping Rochester Awards have been announced.

The Robert Macon Award for Innovation will be presented to the University of Rochester for the Eastman School of Music East Wing addition and renovation of Kodak Hall at Eastman Theatre.

The Betty Strasenburgh Award for Activism will go to Jim Fraser and Jo Dickinson who used their own money to rehabilitate properties on the northeast side of the city.

Lastly, the Director's Award will go to the Village of Pittsford for development plans that include a new town library, an enhanced canal path and the renovation of historic canal-side buildings.

The Rochester Regional Community Design Center announced the inaugural Reshaping Rochester Awards earlier this month. The awards recognize community projects and individuals that further the goals of engagement and quality regional design, officials said.
